with a very quiet, candle-lit chant in the chapel, followed by different stations that you were free to rotate around at your own pace. The stations included: a candle-lit walk in the labyrinth; a table full of paper and lots of different utensils to draw and colour "what Jesus looks like to you"; and a place to read children's picture books. That night made us feel energized, yet relaxed and very much closer to God. We were woken up Monday morning with a howling wind and a storm of leaves. This

We have witnessed a number of changes in the sanctuary over the past several months. First, the grand piano arrived and the pulpit was moved to the right side of the dais. A few weeks ago, the left end of the dais was extended to the walls and, more recently, the old Kimball upright piano was moved from the sanctuary to the Fellowship Hall. On November 30th, the sanctuary was decorated for Advent and Christmas and the Christmas tree was erected.

As this is written, the carpet on the dais extension is being laid and the front face of the dais refinished. Soon, the biggest change of all will occur: The organ will be moved from the loft down to the left side of the dais and seating in the loft will be expanded. It is hoped the move will happen in time for Christmas. A special thanks to everyone who has worked behind the scenes to make this happen.

Most recently, we have become involved with the Burnaby Homeless Task Force and have been helping provide bag lunches for their weekly drop-in hospitality program. We have now made plans to continue this on a monthly basis through 2008.

It has been a joy to welcome Pamela Scott who is now interning this year with us at Deer Lake. Many attended the Naramata Music Week in July. Finally, we brought back the Cultus Lake Campout again this past September. What a great time we all had!

Like any family, we have also experienced some areas of sadness and challenge. We have said goodbye to some members of the family. Some of whom will drop in when they are in Burnaby again, others have returned home and will forever remain in our hearts. We have also had some small financial challenges which will be handled well by the generosity and creativity of our amazing family.

In all 2007 has been quite the year revealing God's promise of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. May that promise be revealed to you and your this season and always.

Deer Lake Cares... Caring & Outreach


1st Sunday – Non perishable food is collected during worship for the Marguerite Dixon Transition House who serve women and their children in finding new beginnings after leaving an abusive home.


Happy Halloween at Deer Lake United!

Thanks to all the families who attended the Party, it was a fun evening!






