Coming for Lent 2015: Book Study!


This Lent, leading up to Easter, Rev. Tracy will be leading a book study Wednesday mornings, 10:30 - 11:30am February 18th through April 1st.

Shaw Go WiFi

Deer Lake United Church gets its telephone and internet service from Shaw Communications. In October, Shaw offered to install three Shaw Go WiFi access points in the church free of charge. These access points would provide free secure internet access almost anywhere in the church to anyone with a Shaw account. The proposal was taken to the Board and approval was given to proceed with the installation, which subsequently occurred in mid-November.

Deer Lake thus becomes part of a Canadawide network of free secure internet access points. By offering Shaw Go WiFi at Deer Lake we provide a convenient service to our members, visitors, tenants and potential renters.

If you are a Shaw customer, look for the Shaw Go WiFi decal at building entrances, or look for the square white device with the blue light on or near the ceiling. Once you've configured your mobile device you have free secure internet access without using up your data plan minutes.

New Offering Envelopes

Regular donations to our church are greatly appreciated, whether through your envelope or PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance). To save money and help the environment, we will be making our own envelopes and issuing them as needed. Many of us do not use all the envelopes in the box in any given year. We encourage people to order what they need (weekly, monthly or, for those on PAR, a small number of envelopes for occasional special donations).

We encourage you to use any envelopes remaining in your 2014 box during 2015 and change the date as needed. So please, write a note, call, or email Kathy R and let me know what you need for January 2015. You will indicate either:

- 1) A new full set of 52 weekly offering envelopes
- 2) A set of 12 monthly envelopes for January to December
- 3) ____ (number of) envelopes for occasional use / special donations.

Thank you for helping our church to save money and be environmentally aware by using only what we need.

On our new website you'll find a calendar of upcoming services, meetings and events; information on major upcoming events such as fundraisers; a link to our facebook page; current and past issues of the newsletter; current policies and related documents; the most recent annual report; samples of our choir singing; and pictures of congregation life and recent events.

Policies? What Policies?

Can I promote my favourite cause during Sunday announcements? Can I borrow a folding table from the church for my family reunion? Who should I talk to about an issue I have? How much would it cost to rent the Fellowship Hall for my event?

These are just a few of the questions I and others receive on a fairly regular basis. I sometimes know the answer, but I often have to refer to the definitive reference: the Deer Lake Policies.

Deer Lake United Church is one of the few churches to have published policies. They were originally created in 2006 in response to a number of misunderstandings and differences of opinion. Each policy was written by the individual(s) and/or committee(s) responsible for the topic covered. In addition to the policies, there are a number of supporting documents (brochures, forms and schedules) that are referenced in the policies.

The policies and supporting documents are reviewed and revised from time to time to ensure they are still relevant and correct. You can find them in a white binder in the library or, better, on the Deer Lake website under Involvement and Growth (http://www.dluc.ca/main/?PoliciesEtc).

There are over 70 documents in all, a third of which are of general interest. These are listed below. The remainder pertain to specific committees or roles. If you serve on a committee or are considering doing so, it's a good idea to quickly read through the policies relevant to that committee. The Policy Index and Glossary is a good place to start. It lists documents by committee, subject and role, and includes a glossary of terms.
